RE: Establishing a Community Well Being Center for Fraser Valley & Surrey

The purpose of this Letter is to submit our proposal of establishing a Community Well Being Center for the Fraser valley and Surrey as well as respectfully request your financial support. We are proposing social responsible program under, the "New Horizons Village Society" (NHVS), a non-profit organization incorporated under the British Columbia Society Act, comprising a group of individuals dedicated to building strong and vibrant communities in the Fraser Valley.

Fraser Valley and Surrey represent a vibrant region in BC that is fastest growing in the nation. However, it faces many challenges. On one hand it has rapidly rising aging population that has severe shortages of subsidized seniors' housing and on the other hand there are growing number of youth getting addicted to drugs, violence and gang lifestyle. Seniors there is severe shortages of subsidized seniors' housing and the problem is becoming more prudent due to growing number of aging seniors' tenants who can no longer function totally independently. Amongst the youth there are perceptible signs of increased involvement in criminal activities while with senior's despondency and a sense of isolation has increasingly impinged on their wellbeing. Seniors and youth are two end of community fabric that plays a key role in building the society.

The goal of the NHVS is to have an integrated approach by connecting the seniors and youth of Fraser valley, irrespective of their cultural, religious or ethnic background to promote health, safety, wellness, art and education. Our goal is to allow seniors' to age at home, in familiar surroundings, with necessary daily life components, rather than move to a long-term care facility. This way care for older people can be shifted from out of institutions and back into the community. Besides having and affordability housing for seniors, we also want to have a senior and Youth) Health and Wellness Center.

NHVS mantra is "Elders can be young and youth can be responsible", by promoting elder's good physical and mental health which is key to their wellness and on the other hand delivering programs that encourage youths to stay away from drugs, crime & gangs and

contribute positively to the society. NHVS, "SAY" (seniors to youth) wellness is to be structured as an integrated program, where besides individual wellness, seniors can also play a role models and mentors to youth. NHVS believes community wellbeing requires adopting a multi-faceted approach for both senior's and youth's (SAY) physical and mental wellness. Experience garnered through collective grassroots activism over the years, provides a lens through which challenges currently confronting the Surrey can be defined.

Following are some of the NHVS's offerings.

- **Seniors Affordable Housing:** Meeting the needs of affordable housing for low-income seniors who can no longer function entirely independently due to declining health. Not only it will benefit low-income seniors with health impairments who require assistance with daily activities, but also provide an environment consisting of social, health, physical, spiritual and other necessary components, to handle day-to-day challenges of seniors.
- **SAY (Senior and Youth) Health and Wellness Center:** Health is the "art of wellness". Good health, physical and mental, is essential for happiness, which in turn have a positive impact in the society and people around-it, through awareness, inspiration and supporting program to stay away from negativity of society and creating role models for future generations. Following are examples of only some of the programs that would help in this directions.
 - **Seniors Aging Awareness, Sensitivity and Self-Confidence Program:** Community senior awareness and sensitivity campaign to fight against age discrimination and the perception that seniors are not important.
 - **Intergenerational Programs - Seniors Helping Youth:** Intergenerational programs that engages seniors acting as mentor, tutors and role models for youths.
 - **Youth Drug and Crime Prevention:** Working with various partners promoting awareness and placing program to prevent youth participation in drugs and crime.
 - **Depression and Rehab Programs.**
 - **Inspirational Programs:** Inspiration programs for all ages to create a positive outlook towards life.
 - **Sports and Recreational:** To promote active life style for both seniors and youth.
 - **Community Events:** Connecting people through various cultural awareness programs and events.
 - **Special Programs –** Such as de addiction centers, elderly abuse prevention programs

NHVS would work with the existing organizations with respect to the above programs as well as to achieve its broader goals. These include City of Surrey, School District 36, Surrey Arts & Heritage society, Surrey RCMP, Kwantlen Polytechnic, SFU, UBC and the Fraser Health Authority. In addition, NHVS will particularly focus on programs & services to contribute to housing and housing options to meet special needs for Seniors within an affordability context.

Honorable Minister, we have had positive and encouraging dialog and discussions with the City of Surrey regarding the NHVS integrated program and offering. City of Surrey, is very supportive of our integrated approach of seniors and youth and discussed potential sites for the NHVS.


We now respectfully request your support for a grant of \$200,000.00 to undertake feasibility analysis including preparation of Business Plan. We are hopeful of receiving a prompt and favorable response.
